

クイックスタートのインストール

SUSE®

SUSE® Linux Enterprise Server 11 SP2の新バージョンをインストールするには次の手順に従います。このマニュアルでは、x86、x86_64、およびia64の各アーキテクチャで、SUSE Linux Enterprise Serverのデフォルトインストールを実行する方法を簡単に説明します。

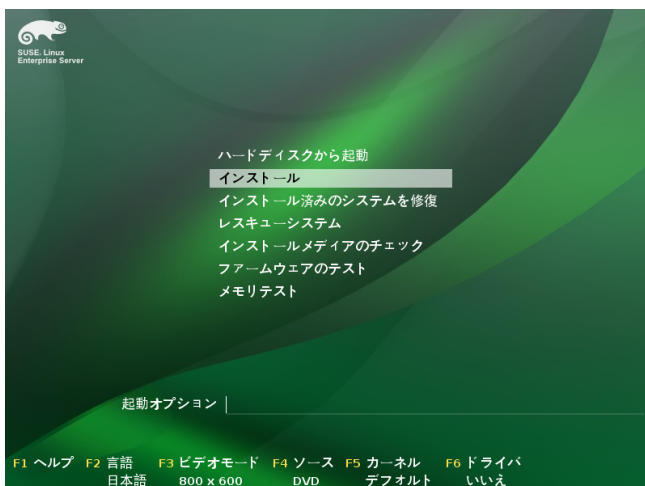
最小限のシステム要件

- Pentium® III 500 MHz以上のプロセッサ（推奨プロセッサは、Pentium 4 2.4 GHz以上か、任意のAMD64またはIntel® EM64T）
- 512MBの物理RAM (1GBを推奨)
- 2GBの空きディスク容量(2GB以上を推奨)。
- ディスク解像度 - 800x600 (1024x768以上を推奨)

SUSE Linux Enterprise Serverのインストール

マシンにLinuxシステムをインストールしていない場合、または既存のLinuxシステムを入れ替えたい場合、これらの手順を使用します。

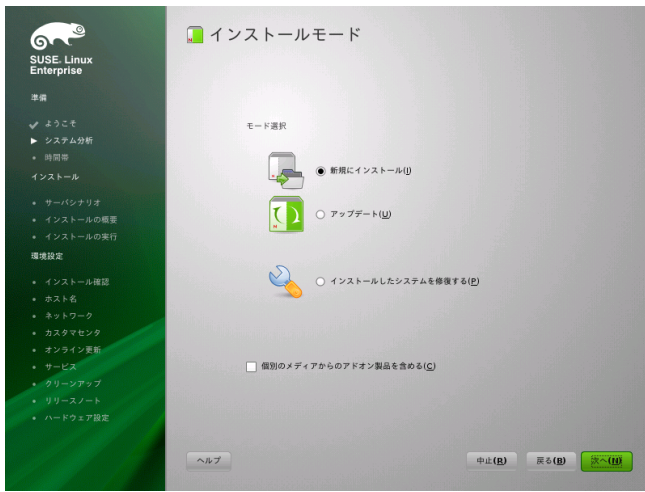
1. SUSE Linux Enterprise Server DVDをドライブに挿入し、コンピュータをリブートして、インストールプログラムを起動します。



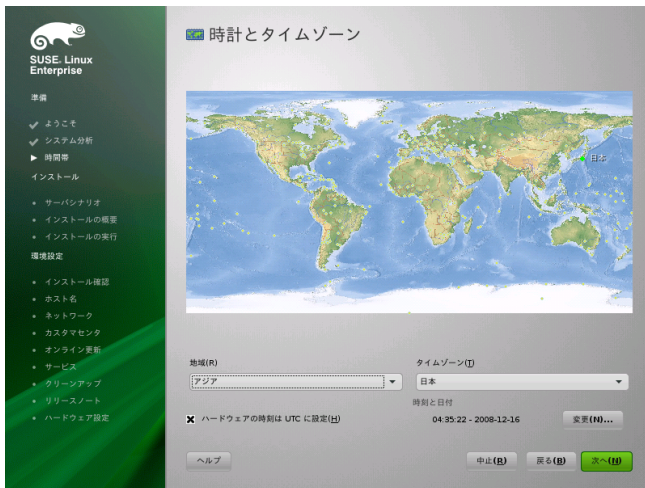
2. ブート画面で [インストール] を選択して、<Enter>キーを押します。これで、SUSE Linux Enterprise Serverのインストールプログラムがロードされ、通常モードでインストールが開始します。



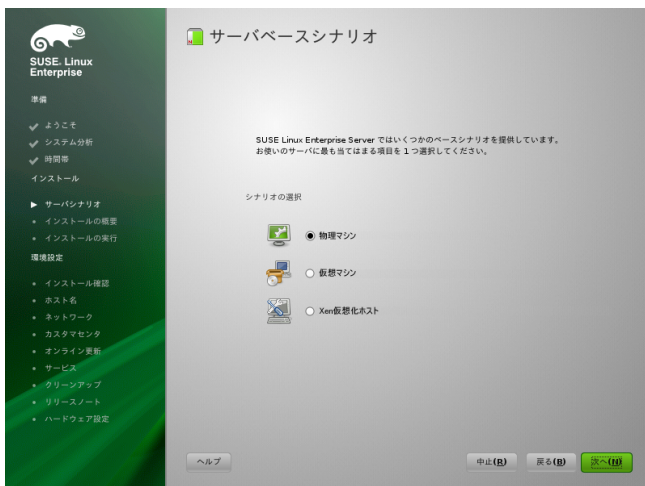
3. インストール時、およびインストールしたシステムに使用する言語を選択します。
4. ライセンス契約書を読み、[はい、ライセンスに同意します] をクリックします。[次へ] で続行します。



5. 新規にインストールするか、SUSE Linux Enterprise Serverの旧バージョンからアップデートするか決定します。[次へ]で続行します。



6. システムで使用する時計とタイムゾーンを選択します。[次へ]で続行します。



7. 基本のオペレーティングシステムを、[物理マシン]上にインストールするか、または[仮想マシン]を

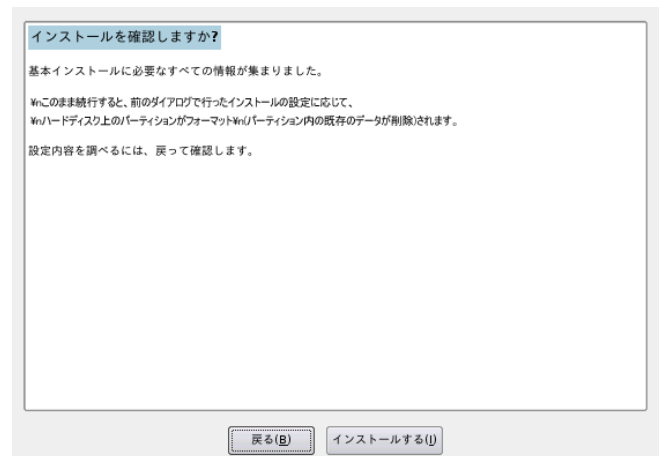
選択してXENマシン内の仮想ゲストとしてインストールするか、[XEN仮想化ホスト]オプションを使用して他の仮想マシンを実行できる仮想ホストとしてインストールするかを決定します。[次へ]で続行します。



8. 提案されたインストールとパーティションのオプションの数をインストール設定画面に表示し、任意のオプションを変更します。

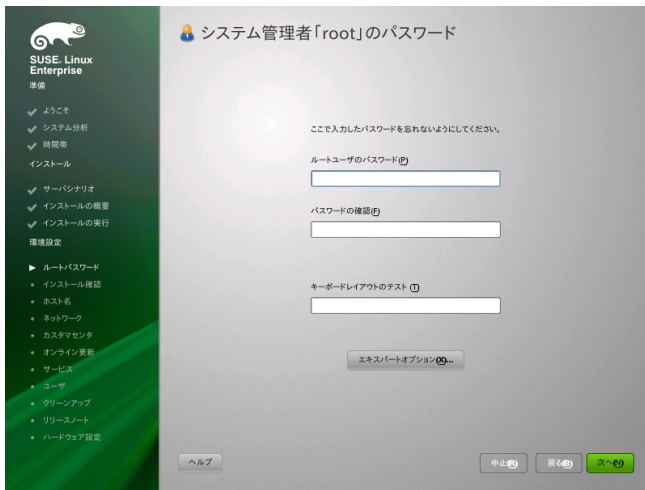
[概要] タブには、(最も一般的なインストール事例で)手動介入が必要な場合のある基本オプションが含まれています。[エキスパート] タブには、高度な設定オプションが含まれています。

9. 使用許諾契約を受諾する場合は、[了解] をクリックします。



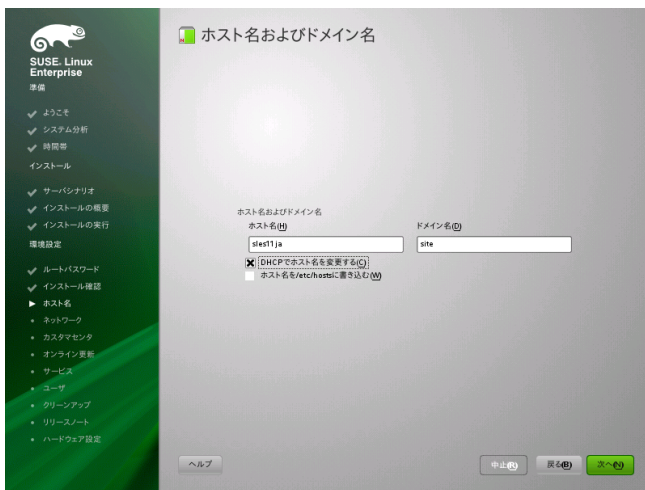
10. [インストールする] をクリックしてインストールを開始します。

選択したすべてのソフトウェアパッケージの基本のシステムセットアップとインストールを完了すると、SUSE Linux Enterprise Serverインストールは新しいLinuxシステムをブートします。再起動の後、次の画面が表示されます。



11. システム管理者(rootユーザと呼ぶ)のアカウントのパスワードを入力します。

rootパスワードは忘れないようにしてください。ここで入力すると、このパスワードを取得することはできません。管理上の支援を受けない限り、リセットできません。[次へ]で続行します。

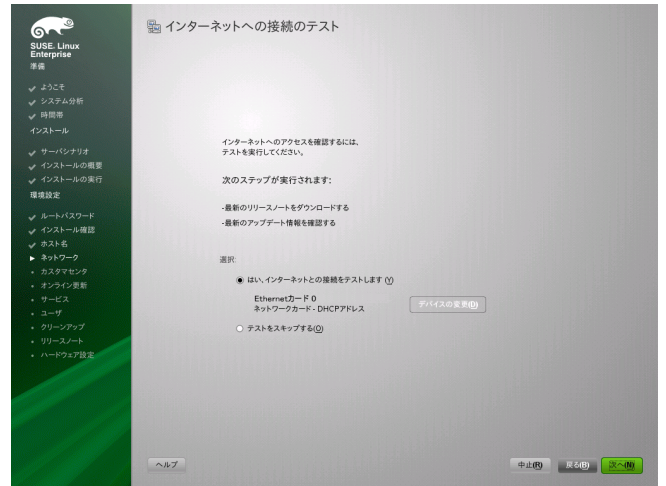


12. このコンピュータの名前とDNSドメインを入力します。[次へ]で続行します。

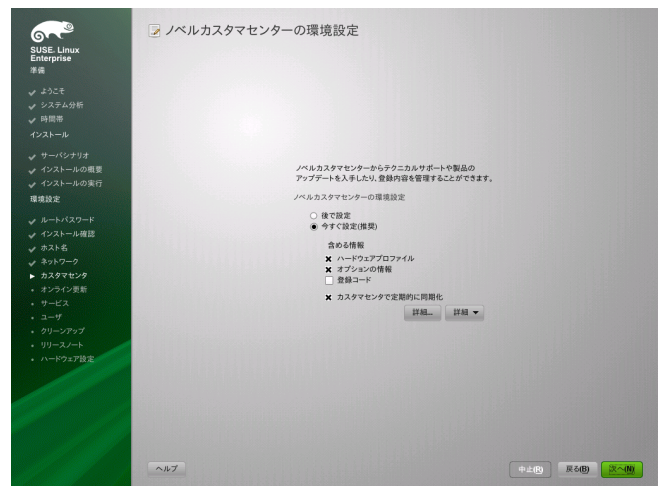


13. ネットワーク設定画面で、システムのネットワーク接続を表示または変更します。

ネットワークデバイス(ネットワークカード、ワイヤレスカード、DSL接続、ISDNアダプタ、モデムなど)がある場合は、それらをここで設定することを推奨します。インターネット接続によってSUSE Linux Enterprise Serverに入手可能なあらゆるアップデートを取得し、インストールに加えることができるからです。[次へ]で続行します。



14. インターネット接続をテストするには、[はい、インターネットとの接続をテストします]をクリックします。このオプションでは最新のSUSE Linux Enterprise Serverのリリースノートがないか調べることができます。[次へ]で続行します。
15. [インターネット接続のテストの実行]画面でテストの結果を確認します。[次へ]で続行します。



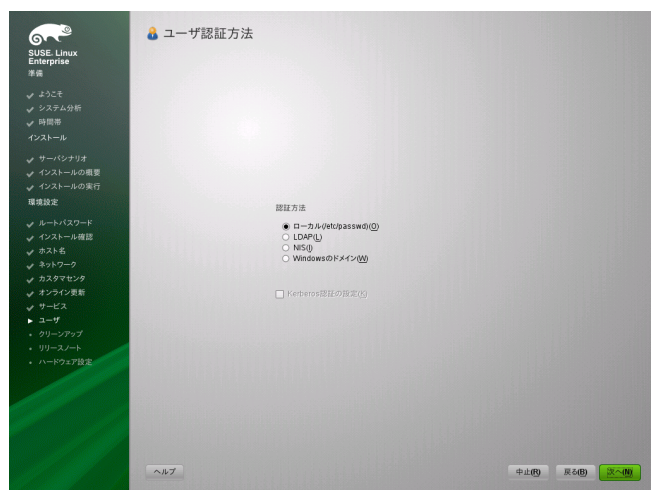
16. [ノベルカスタマセンターの環境設定]画面で[今すぐ設定] > [次へ] > [続行]の順に選択してオンラインアップデートを有効にします。

[後で設定] > [次へ]の順にクリックしてこのステップをスキップし、インストールを続行します。

製品のインストール後にこのオプションを設定することができます。[次へ]で続行します。



17. デフォルトでは SUSE Linux Enterprise Serverはシステムに対する証明書を作成します。これを無効にするには、[環境設定をスキップ] > [次へ] の順にクリックします。[次へ]で続行します。

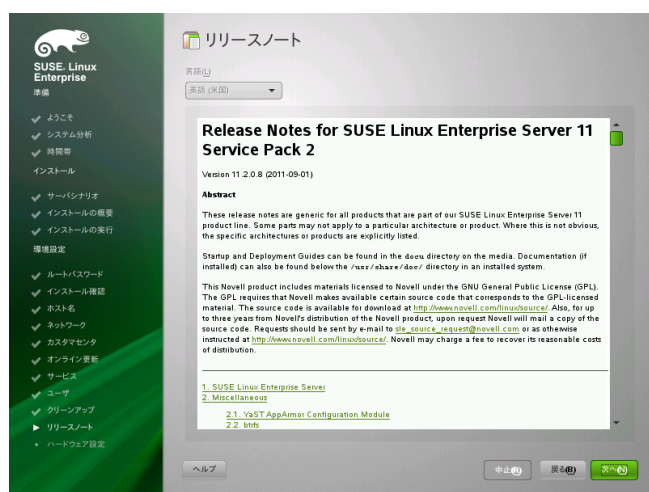


18. ユーザ認証方法画面で、システム管理者に別な選択を指示されない限り [ローカル(/etc/passwd)] を選択します。[次へ]で続行します。

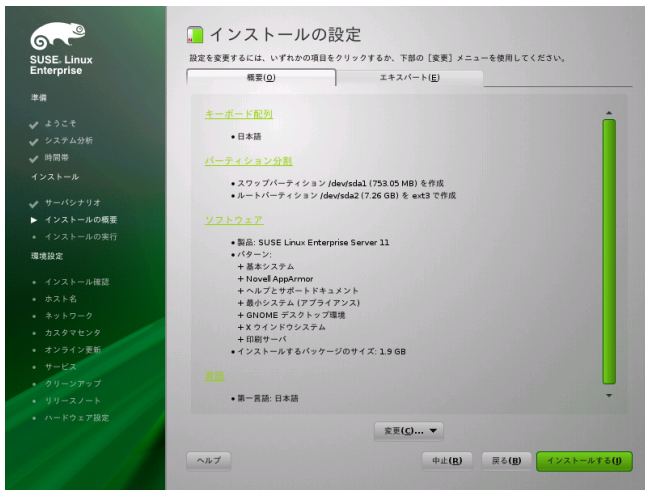


19. [ユーザのフルネーム] フィールドに自分の姓名を入力し、[ユーザ名] フィールドにログイン名を、[パスワード] フィールドに(システム管理者が推奨したとおりの)パスワードを入力します。

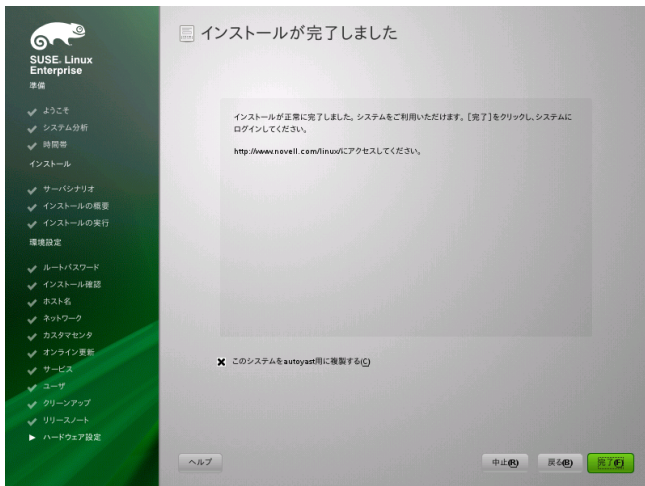
セキュリティ上の理由から、パスワードは8文字の長さとし、大文字、小文字、数字を組み合わせなければなりません。パスワードは最長72文字とし、大文字小文字を区別します。[次へ]で続行します。



20. システム設定が完了したら、リリースノートを表示します。[次へ]で続行します。



21. [ハードウェア設定] 画面を使って、グラフィックカードとその他のハードウェアデバイスを表示または設定します。[次へ] で続行します。



22. [インストールが完了しました] 画面で、[完了] をクリックするとSUSE Linux Enterprise Serverインストールが終了し、続いて、ログイン画面が表示されます。
23. ユーザ名を入力し、[パスワード] フィールドにパスワードを入力し、最後に<Enter>キーを押します。

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
