1.1 The Safari 4.0.4 Application Might Fail after Virtualizing

It is possible that Safari* version 4.0.4 might fail after you have created the virtual application if not configured correctly. Please make sure that you follow these steps exactly when you build the application:

- **1** Select Option 2 in the configuration wizard.
- **2** Run the wizard and provide all required information, but do not build the application.
- **3** Modify the .xappl configuration file by setting the enhancedDEPCcompatibility attribute to "true."
- **4** Build the application.
- **5** Close ZENworks Application Virtualization, then delete the Safari sandbox.
- **6** Run the virtualized Safari application.
